Some important information culled from our October 12 Council meeting...

Engineering and Public Works Committee (Vice-Chair Bob Lacroix) (September 22, 2021)

- Received an update on the Blue Box Regulations, which will make the producers of products and packaging fully responsible for managing their products. The proposed new date for this transition to occur is November 19, 2024.
- District will be hiring a consultant for a Safety Analysis report on Various Trail Crossing
 of District Roads. Report is scheduled to be completed by October 29, 2021, at a cost of
 \$29,000.





An Important Message to Our Community About Huntsville Hospital

Attention Patients/Family Members/Visitors

We are installing a new back-up power generator at Huntsville District Memorial Hospital.

In order to do this, we are shutting down the emergency back-up power system for <u>6 hours</u> on

Wednesday, October 20, 2021 at 9 a.m.

During this outage, the hospital will have very **LIMITED CAPACITY** to see and treat new patients. We encourage you to see your family doctor or another community health care provider instead of coming to the hospital.

During the outage:

- Our Emergency Dept. will provide <u>emergent care only;</u>
- · Ambulances will bypass HDMH where safe to do so;
- Emergent patients will be stabilized and transported out;
- No scheduled surgeries, planned obstetrical deliveries;
- No scheduled outpatient tests, clinics or treatments;
- No visitors will be permitted on October 20;
- Lighting, heating/cooling, and elevators will not operate.

Our teams will be focused on providing safe, high-quality care to our current patients during the outage.

We also anticipate increased traffic and volumes at South Muskoka Memorial Hospital (SMMH) in Bracebridge.

Applicants must have experienced a qualifying revenue decline of at least 50% in the reported 2020-2021 year (a period that reflects COVID-related losses) compared to fiscal year-end 2019 (a pre-COVID, baseline year).

Community Planning Permit By-Law:

This is the latest of innovative by-law "firsts" brought forward by Lake of Bays Township. We were the first municipality in Ontario to implement a Development Permit System to differentiate waterfront from the typical Comprehensive Zoning By-Law and here we are again providing more tools to implement the by-laws while allowing discretionary uses and affording more authority to staff.

This is an item on the planning agenda of October 26th and all interested parties should be aware of this.
