

Minutes of cottage Association meeting Sunday June 29 1975 at the Guselle
Cottage

Mr. Al Wingfield was voted to act as Chairman and Betty Guselle as Clerk. Mayor Malcolm Scott and our Council representative Mrs. Esther Spencer and 23 cottagers attended.

The principal subject discussed was our road, the trees removed, and what the council planned to do about it. The mayor told us the road had to be widened to permit heavy equipment to come in as this was the only type used. The trading of a 66' road allowance around the lake for the road was discussed and the cottagers were in favour of this being made legal. The mayor said we would be responsible for the legal cost. Mr. Scott said complaints had been made about the condition of the road in the early spring and this could only be avoided if we did not use it for a couple of weeks when the frost was coming out of it. We were told that Mr. George Lupton the road superintendant is the only one authorized to cut wood but apparently some one had cut more wood than required on Mr. Wingfield's property.

A vote was taken about grading the road now that the trees were cut and the grading approved. The cottagers are anxious that our road be as private as possible and a sign "No Access" be placed at the entrance. The property taxes are due to rise considerably next year perhaps by \$40 according to Mr. Scott because of school costs. We will send letters of protest on behalf of the cottage association to Mr. Wells, Minister of Education and Local MPP Mr. Thomas Wells. Mrs. Judy Calder will attend the 11 August meeting at Baysville when the official plan for the district is presented before it goes to the O.M.B. David Brown will get her a set of the plans. We would like the Hydro to take more care in spraying and this was later discussed with Doug Slatter and we will speak to the man in charge of this work. We also discussed the need for a moderate speed limit on the road and agreed that signs should not be necessary, just individual restraint and consideration. There is some refuse on the roadside and abandoned appliances which we must try to have carted away.

Another meeting is planned for the Saturday of the Labour Day weekend at 2 P.M. at the Guselle cottage. Those members present donated \$1.00 each to the clerk for her mailing expenses.
