Fire Status & Fireworks:



Not to sound repetitive but for those of us who call this home, the potential of fire is always at the top of our minds when we mix dry conditions with fireworks, please continue to refrain from using fireworks.

This week the rating has dropped to moderate, but that does not mean we can drop our guard. We get updated from the MNRF regarding soil/ground conditions and yesterday's report was favorable enough to drop it to Moderate. **As for fireworks, our residents and visitors need to be** *aware the current bylaw allows for them only on July 1 and statutory holidays between "dusk and 11pm".....which means Monday, May 22nd and Saturday, July 1st are acceptable, subject to weather conditions. Any other time must be requested. Hopefully those choosing to indulge will do so responsibly. We are ready for any event for those who don't ...and fines are likely.* **Concerns in lake of Bays**?
